
Secretary presented his report, followed by the Chairman.

Treasurer's Report 2023

Good evening everyone.

There are copies of the account sheet on the tables for you to see.

The blind auction this year made £255.00 and we have rounded this up to £300.00 for our yearly charity Encephalitis International which was presented to Roger Kellow earlier this evening. We have received £95.00 from the National MMOC as our members annual rebate based on numbers of MMOC members attending the branch clubnights and this is why you need to sign the blue folder - so please keep signing this.

We also received £850.22 from the National club as help towards Moggyfest / Southern Regional Rally, so we broke even on that. We did however raise an extra £774.74 from teas, raffles, tombolas etc which is not included in these figures,

This year the committee decided to purchase a Minor Van and trailer for £7600.00. The insurance on this is £128.92, We also purchased a reversing camera for £37.98 and there have been various sundries such as petrol and getting it home from Northants which was £126.84. The Committee had estimated the value of the van at £10,000.00 which appears in the operating surplus of the accounts together with the spares surplus. The money used for this purchase was taken from the reserve account which is our self insurance for the spares that now consists of cash and assets.

A deposit of £500.00 has been paid for the 2025 annual dinner and dance and entry form should be in your current newsletters. These should be returned as soon as possible and before December club night.

We usually make a donation to the charity supported by Wolvercroft World of Plants in return for our use of their field for our show in August. As we have only just been advised of the preferred charity (Breast Cancer Now) we will be making a £100 donation in the next few days (out of 2024-25 accounts).
