





The only trouble is, they are a little difficult to fit with the drop glass in place. The fronts are not too bad, but I think I am going to have to lower the glass in the rears to get them in. Looking at the rubbish in the bottom of the old door, I think this has caused the retention of moisture encouraging the rust which has led to its demise. The old type window seals aren't so good at keeping out the detritus. Just the front nearside wing to sort out now and the respray will be next on the horizon. – Perhaps next year – who knows?

# GOODWOOD REVIVAL MEETING

If you get the chance to go to the Goodwood revival meeting then do so! I first went four years ago when a work colleague, Angela said she was racing her 1955 AC

Ace, which raced at Goodwood in the 1950's. I met her at Goodwood, and I was amazed at what I saw.

It is best described as walking on to the set in a "Heartbeat" episode; a good 50% of people are dressed up in period clothing dating from the 1940's to 1966 when motor racing finished at Goodwood. Angela was "invited" to race her car that year, and had a collection of passes which enabled a behind-the-scenes poke around the pits – *strictly pre 66 clothes, gentlemen to wear ties at all times!* I have been every year since, and this



year I went for two days, there is so much to see! I wore my 1945 De-Mob suit, complete with gas mask, trilby hat and accessories, I parked in the pre –1966 car park at about 8am and managed a space in the front row. There were 1000's of cars, I counted 8 pre war racing Bentleys each worth the price of a small house! There were quite a few Morrisses, but the quality and quantity of cars was astound-ing, it was better than any car show I have been to. When you order you tickets,





Goodwood send you a pre-'66 car park pass for no extra charge!

From the car park you enter the revival circuit; you are greeted by a display of vintage Police cars and drivers including a Dr Who Tardis police box. To the right was a recreated "Glam Cabs" set from "Carry on Cabby" All the girls are there in their outfits, complete with Mk1 Ford Cortinas and lit up 'Glam Cab' signs, even the old Taxis were there including PEG 1 (See photo of me with the girls Ding Dong!!!) There are so

> many set pieces to see, a complete Dad's Army was there, lots of vintage vans, buses, a recreation of the 1948 Motor Show (but no Morris!!!) and a representation of the original Porsche dealership in the UK (AFN – Isleworth) and lots more. The displays vary each year. The main thing you are there for is the

racing, and my God they do race! For the age of the cars it is amazing to watch. The St Mary's Trophy is for production saloon cars produced from 1950-1959. They are all tuned to the limit and they go so fast! There was a 1949 Morris Minor Low Light entered by Ian Kellett, which had a later 1098 engine and a 1958 Morris 1000 saloon entered by Russell Martin. (Both Pictured).

Other cars included A35's, A50's, Wolseley 1500, Jaguar Mk 1, Standard 10 and a 1956

Austin A95 Westminster which rolled on the Saturday race, bashed into an A35, was repaired and won on the Sunday!

If you go under the circuit you can walk around the pits and see some of the cars being tested & tuned, I can not believe, with health and safety you are still allowed to do so. There is Vintage bike racing, which is thrilling to watch.

Overhead there are displays by Spitfires, Hurricanes and other vintage aircraft.

All around there are jazz bands, vintage stalls, dancing and some fantastic period clothing, it is a family day out, so much to see and stare at!

My ticket this year for the three days was £100, this sounds a bit steep, but you do get a lot for it, there are 8 races on the Saturday alone. My advice, if you have a birthday coming up ask for tickets, as it sells out quite quickly, mine were for my 40th and I had the time of my life! Phil Traves.
