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

bootlid repair

Having previously had a go at repairing doors using the standard repair kits, I thought I would have a go at a boot lid. Laurie kindly donated an old (early) type boot lid some while ago which was now surplus to requirements and I had bought a repair kit a few years back. It struck me as being a bit difficult looking since the boot lid curves in two directions. What actually spurred me on to do the job was the need to practice a bit of body soldering for work the Porsche. I bought a solder kit from Frosts, which was a bit pricey, but the quality was pretty good, and everything worked as planned. All you can ask for really?

The repair kit comes in two parts, the lower outer 100mm or so, of the lid and the inside strip. The outer panel (handily) comes with a step or 'joggle' along the top edge – which saves a lot of work (Photo 1).

The first job on the bootlid is to mark out the cut line by carefully clamping the new bit on top of the old one so that the bottom edges line up (more or less). (Photo 2). You then make the cut approximately 12mm lower so that there is an overlap. The scrap bottom bit is then cut off. Photo 3 shows the new section being fitted and Photo 4 shows the exposed internal bootlid cavity. Next clean up the internal rust as best you can. I used a rotary wire brush on the angle grinder and sprayed the inside with zinc rich, weldthrough primer. Photo 5 shows trial fitting of the inner strip and the outer repair section being tapped into place. This is where your Morris Minor Saloon comes in handy to make sure you have the new bit in the right place. Note the new section temporarily taped on to the bootlid with Gaffer tape and being checked for fit by my slightly balding twin brother (Photo 6). Having got the outer bit in the right place, put a couple of tack welds on just to hold it in place. (Photo 7). The inner strip now needs to go in and this takes a bit of hammering, grinding and welding to achieve. You should find that the outer repair section starts to assume the correct curvature both vertically and horizontally. (Photo 8). The lower lip of the outer panel where it bends over the inner strip is 'plug' welded in about 4 positions. I used my trusty spot weld cutter to make the holes (Photo 9) or you can use a 'proper' spot welder (if you have one- which I don't).. Photo 10 shows the boot lid cleaned and ready for body soldering and the 'tinning' of the areas to be soldered and Photo 11 shows the solder being applied. Photo 12 shows the finished article. Just needs a light application of filler, removal of the rest of the old paint, prep and paint. Job done. Easy!! (perhaps not!) (Incidentally, it is now for sale, so if anyone is interested??) rupert goes to brooklands



Having bought Rupert in a half tidy condition from near Taunton. Somerset 12 months ago, I had set myself a target date for his first proper show appearance at the Austin & Morris day at Brooklands on 7th March. As is always the case when you start restoration work, small jobs turn into BIG iobs. That

together with the prolonged cold winter weather meant that progress was not as speedy as hoped and somewhat behind schedule. However all welding is completed and the chassis fully rust proofed and protected. Interior is finished and all that remains to be done is old engine and gearbox out and then a paint job on the 'engine house'. You would call it the engine compartment but friends from Denmark call it the engine house which we thought was rather a nice description. Next fit the new engine and gearbox, clutch, alternator, water pump, electronic ignition, and halogen headlights all which were purchased some 5 months ago! Where would we be without Bull Motif? (other Morris Minor specialist are available - Ed). So by the beginning of March it was painfully obvious that Rupert was not ready for Brooklands! Not to be beaten I decided that Rupert 'would go to the Ball' on our trailer - not guite Cinderella's coach but good as. Saturday March 6th arrived and after a few more last minute jobs including a hastily rebuilt front grill we loaded him onto the trailer, secured him tightly and he was ready for a 7am start the next day from Silverstone to Brooklands. Having attended the show last year (without a Morris) and thoroughly enjoyed it I was really looking forward to it. Arrived at 9.20am and having explained that Rupert would have to remain on the trailer the parking attendant found us a place on the end of a line. This was ideal as it meant that people could bend down and have a really good view of Rupert's magnificent underside. Lots of appreciative comments on how tidy he looked.

There was an excellent turnout of the Austin and Morris range especially the Minors, the only one missing I think was the Austin Allegro.

Brooklands is a fantastic place to visit, especially for me as having lived in Silverstone all my life the racing connections are of great interest. Silverstone started its racing life after the Second World War and at present is undergoing major changes

to bring it into line with the other Grand Prix circuits around the world. But the Brooklands Motor Course was constructed in 1907 and a wonder of its age. Much of the track and many of its original buildings and features survive to this day. The first official race was held on 6th July 1907 and in August 1926 the RAC organised the first-ever British Grand Prix constructing sand chicanes along the finishing straight. The museum displays a wide range of Brooklands related motoring and aviation exhibits ranging from giant racing cars such as the 24 litre Napier-Railton to a unique collection of Vickers BAC-built aircraft including the Second World War Wellington Bomber, Viking, Varsity, Vanguard, VC10, BAC One Eleven and of course Concorde. Brooklands can be found just off J 10 of the M25 south of Weybridge.

I was lucky enough to be parked next to Jay Le-Huray from Southampton and his 'Mildred' (with the 1275cc engine and 5 speed gearbox) complete with his self built caravan. You can see from the picture that it has all the home comforts and I enjoyed a welcome cup of tea. Roll on next March and the next Brooklands Austin & Morris day. I shall be there. But long before that Rupert will be all ready and able to attend the rallies under his own steam. See you at the National Rally in June.
