We supported this Charity a few years ago and had a talk by a representative. It seems a very worthwhile cause and we are glad to be helping this organisation again.

The story of Julia's House, the Dorset Children's Hospice, is a remarkable and moving one.

It was the brainchild of Julia Perks, a children's nurse who trained at Great Ormond Street and who worked at Poole General Hospital caring for life-limited children. Julia recognised the need for far greater support for these children and their families. Tragically, Julia died of cancer before she could take this vision much further and it was left to her friends and family to make her dream come true.

Today Julia's House provides a community respite service: trained Carers who visit the family home and look after the child, and now a wonderful home in Corfe Mullen too, known simply as Julia's House, offering further respite care to these children.

Sadly there will always be children who are unlikely to live into adulthood, and research indicates there are up to 200 Dorset families with such a child. Julia's House currently helps 70 of them. Their conditions include muscular dystrophy, severe cerebral palsy, spinal muscular atrophy, and brain tumours. The more funds the charity raises, the more care it can provide and the more families it can reach.

In just a few months the opening of Julia's House has resulted in a

doubling of patient referral rates to the charity, and thirty children using the hospice regularly with tailored care packages for each child's medical condition.



This beautiful home-fromhome, together with the continuing work of the Julia's House Carers in families' own homes, is your local children's hospice service: a free service for every family in Dorset who should ever need it.

beaulieu steam revival 6 june



Over the weekend of 5th and 6th June Beaulieu held a steam rally. It was called the revival as it was reviving the steam rallies held at Beaulieu for many years during the 1960's and 1970's. We were met on our arrival by a fabulous smell of steam and the sight of smoke floating across the arounds of the museum. There was excellent array of steam cars being

driven around the grounds. A long row of traction engines was working away at wood cutting, apple pressing etc etc. The highlight was the display of the entire fleet of Showman's Engines once used by Anderton and Rowland during the early 1900's and brought together for the first time in preservation. Some original steam driven fairground rides were also in use including the 1898 Savage Three Abreast Gallopers and the 1934 Orton and Spooner Mayhew's Ark Speedway ride. The latter was greatly enjoyed by Louise and we had to have a go on it every time we walked past.

Another enaine was giving trailer rides around the grounds. All in all this was an excellent day out as entry to the museum and house was also included in the entrance fee. Next years show will be on 4th and 5th June 2011 and I for one be will there. Laurie
