



Morris Eight Series E 2 Seater Tourer – 1939 ABW 135 - "Albert" Owned by Nev and Lyn Gerry of Poole

"Albert" was built at Morris Motors, Cowley, Oxford on 11th – 18th January 1939 and despatched to Durrants Garage, Oxford Road, Kidlington on 1st February that year. He was sold for the sum of £132 10s plus 27/6 for the spare wheel cover finished in body colour (7 shillings cheaper if painted

black!) and registered to his first keeper - Mr John Frederick Hawkins of Staverton Close, Bracknell on 6th February 1939. Mr Hawkins was a dentist and he kept "Albert" for 64 vears! Mr Hawkins moved to St Martins, Stamford in 1984 taking "Albert" with him.

After his death, the car was purchased on 3rd May 2003, by Mr Timothy David



Grahame - another dentist - of Westwates Close, Bracknell meaning that "Albert" was once again in his home town. By this time major restoration was required. Mr Grahame had purchased the car as a project to complete whilst he underwent treatment for cancer but he sadly died and ownership passed to his wife Mrs Gillian Mavis Grahame on 16th November 2003. In order to sell "Albert" Mrs Grahame had the restoration finished – albeit not to a good standard!

In June 2005 "Albert" featured in a very small article in The Automobile and he was offered for sale on Ebay very soon after. He had to be removed from sale



as he did not match his description and we agreed to buy him on 2nd July 2005. As he was MOT'd -God knows how! - He was taken to his first show in our ownership on the very next day and despite a couple of breakdowns he managed to win a prize!

Since then we have done a lot of work to bring "Albert" up to the condition you see him in today. He now shines for the first time in many years and has had a new roof fitted along with new side screens. He was missing 2 of the

original hubcaps, which we managed to track via Ebay. When purchased he was fitted with the wrong front seats, which have since been replaced with the correct type. The rear bumper has also been re-chromed with the front one hopefully following soon.

The Series E Tourer is a very rare car indeed as it was only built in 1939. Morris did not reintroduce the Tourer after the war. A slightly different open model was built in Australia up until 1947.

The Tourer was available as a 2 seater priced at £132 10s or as a 4 seater priced at £135.

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
