



my morris Van . . . an e-bay wreck

The story of a Minor Van Restoration by Tony and Sue Ware



purchased the van on e-bay in July 2009 from a gentleman in Leominster. A friend. Les offered to come with me to pick it up with his transporter. We arrived home with a van with the engine the passenger side floor, the seat frames thrown in the back and lots of bits and bobs in card-

board boxes.

I then set about dismantling it and seeing what was needed to rebuild it. I arranged to have the chassis and body sandblasted, then all the necessary welding

was done to the body and chassis. I then primed and glossed the chassis. The rear body work and cab were then taken on my trailer to my son and his partner's body shop, Kustom Kolors for prep and re-spraying.

In the meantime, I ordered the necessary, parts, of which there



was a lot from ESM in Sussex and the interior trim from Newton Com-

mercial. My brother, Roger and stripped the engine to check inside and found it in perfect condition, so rebuilt the engine and painted it.

After I picked up the body and cab from



Kustom Kolors I started to re-assemble the van. I upgraded the brake system to disc brakes and servo and fitted $5^{1}/_{2}J$ steel wheels. It took approximately 11 months to finish my latest project and have it MOT'd and on the road.
