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


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The MMOC Dorset Branch



Also there could be Bournemouth cars that were registered later than Smokey. Bournemouth Borough Council had its own allocation of registration letters EL. JT and RU but they are not carrying a County Registration and those letter were allocated to the Borough when Bournemouth was part of Hampshire, so in my book don't count. I am not sure what was happening in Poole back in 1970, was Poole part of Dorset or still part of Hampshire? I wonder when Poole registered cars started to carry a Dorset registration rather than a Southampton issued Hampshire registration?

So can any body argue that I would be wrong in claiming Smokey was the last Registered



car sold in Weymouth or even Dorset.

Footnote: My information on registration letters is gleaned from an old AA Year book from the early 1950's. I don't have the book in my possession so I don't have the full list of all of the Issuing Authorities only photocopies of the part of the year book that was referred to as the "Motor-Car Index Marks".

Smokey (by Mike Pattison)



Hi Brian. I took these photos of my Morris Minor at Breamore House during vesterdays Mid-Summer Saunter. Please use them if they are of any use.

I have been researching Smokey's background, so far I have uncovered the fol-

I am the fourth owner having acquired her in February this year through an advert in the Dorset Advertiser.

NJT 487J was supplied on the 29th August 1970 by the Main BMC Distributor. Western Motors of Bournemouth to E Channon & Sons Ltd. of Dorchester Road, Weymouth. A pre-delivery Service check was carried out by Channons and she was sold with 92 miles on the clock on 1st September 1970 to Mr Abbott of Windermere Crescent, Weymouth.

Mr Abbott appears to have had the car

regularly serviced by E Channon & Sons Ltd who around about 1977 moved their servicing operations from Weymouth up to 6 High East Street, Dorchester. The last recorded servicing in the original BMC "Passport to Servicing" booklet was in October 1985, Smokey by this time had covered 33417 miles. Sadly Channon's no longer exist. 6 High Street East is now a wine distributors.

From the Tax discs and MOT Certificates that are in my possession it would appear Smokey's keeper remained Mr Abbott until 1999 when her mileage was recorded at 41749 miles.

Smokey was then acquired by a Mr Smith of Dorchester who was the keeper until 2008 by which time she had covered 82,400 miles.

The car was purchase by Mr E Stanley of Wyke Regis. Weymouth who kept her until I purchased Smokey in February 2012 with 87000 miles recorded.

The car know resides back in Weymouth with me in Southill, no more than 600 yards from where she spent the first 29 nine years of her driving career.

I believe Smokey could be the last Morris Minor sold in Weymouth, or even possibly registered in the County of Dorset. The J registration was introduced on 1st August 1970, so most of the Morris Minor's sold in Weymouth and the county ending in J would probably have been registered on the 1st August. Smokey was registered a month later on 1st September.

JT were the Dorset registration letters presumably issued by Dorchester County Hall. So unless there are any Morris Minors with a first letter alphabetically greater than N or a NJT number greater than 487 then it follows that Smokey was the last. Can anybody argue that I am incorrect in my assumption? There were other registration letters available to Dorset County Hall they were FX, PR and TK, I don't know if they were in use in 1970. Were any Morris Minors registered in Dorset the following year with a registration ending in K?
