

Footman James Classic Car Show (by Dave Holton)

BIRMINGHAM: 16-18 NOV 2012. I have just returned from my annual pilgrimage to the Classic Car Show. It was bigger and better than ever this year (at least no problems with rain or mud as with other events this season! I arrived nice and early and queued to get in for the 9am start and within 5 minutes of being in one of the halls I feasted my eyes on something REALLY INTERESTING - to me anyway. There was the Austin Loadstar lorry that was used as the ultimate get away vehicle to carry the cash stolen from the iconic Great Train Robbery which took place on August 8th 1963. (All this not far from where I live). The Austin was fitted with a secret compartment between the chassis rails to carry 3 tons of mail bags containing around 3 million pounds - a sum equivalent to 45-50 million today. It was bought by the robbers from a war department sale and still in khaki was escorted by 2 Land Rovers, also in khaki, from the robbery site to the hide out where the cash was counted. The robbers believed that an army convoy would be unlikely to be stopped by the police. The bulk of the money was never recovered and guess what a Morris Minor van was used to transfer some of the dosh after the count up. The Austin lorry was confiscated by Scotland Yard and eventually sold. I wonder if the Morris Minor van is still around - what a tale it could tell. This year's show spanned 11 halls with an estimated 1500 cars and let's not forget the 350 motorcycles on display ranging from the rare and exciting to the pre war and retro classics, family saloons to super cars and many, many more. And so many trade stands to enjoy. Both M.M.O.C and the Minor L.C.V. register had vehicles on display attracting lots of attention. And a really big plus this year was the chance to watch the attempt to partially restore a Minor pickup over the 3 days by the Practical Classics Magazine crew. This was on the Wheeler Dealer Live stage. By 11 o'clock on the Saturday morning they had fitted the back body to the chassis. Prior to the show the truck had been painted and the brakes all fixed. John Simpson then spent the rest of Saturday rebuilding the engine with most of the parts supplied by East Sussex Minors. He hoped to have it installed and running by Saturday evening. Once it's completed it will be Practical Classics Magazine's work hack. Due to the sheer volume of people at the show it was virtually impossibe to take photos but I did manage one. I guess that shows just how popular our hobby is.

Whilst visiting the M.M.O.C. display I did manage to get my paws on the new Traveller book by Ray Newell. Pam has ordered me a copy so that will keep me occupied over Christmas. I also managed to pick up a few bits and bobs from the autojumble.

One has to say that the annual pilgrimage to this show is a must - there's nothing like it and it's not to be missed. Having said that, it is not for the faint hearted as the size of the show and the Saturday crowds are a bit daunting. I think next year I may try and attend on the Friday, it's a bit more expensive but perhaps the crowds may just be a little smaller.

Well that's my Morris Minor adventures over for 2012. Let's hope for some sunshine and dry conditions for 2013. My next outing will be the Austin Morris day at Brooklands on March 10th 2013. Those of you who are coming to the Annual Dinner and Dance event in January are requested to dig deep and bring a raffle prize or two. Thanks very much.







DORSET BRANCH SPARES NEWS

This month's new line is re-conditioned carburettors...

We can now offer reconditioned carburettors on an exchange basis. If your Minor runs badly and you have sorted out all the electrical components, the carburettor



may be past it's best performance. They tend to wear away quietly hiding under the air filter. We now have a stock of reconditioned. HS2's with or without the breather. These are usually between £120 and £140 with a hefty surcharge on the old unit plus p & p. They are available from us for a mere £95 each (exchange). They have been stripped and carefully bead blasted with glass media. They all have a new float needle and seat and throttle spindle. Plus, they have re-plated levers and are fitted with new choke and accelerator pinch bolts and supplied with new gaskets. New jets are fitted and needles to suit 1098 and late 948.(If you need an early model, please speak to Brian).

Morris Centenary—Beaulieu 2013



I am sure it wont have escaped your attention, but next year is the Centenary of the first year of production of Morris Cars. To celebrate this milestone, the MMOC is coordinating various events throughout the year at different locations. The national rally is to be an 'international' event on 15-16th June at Cornbury Park home of Lord and Lady Rotherwick, which is situated just outside Oxford. Provision will be made for all Morris related Clubs to be represented and for the largest assembly of Morris vehicles in decades to be prominently displayed, with support from many Morris specialists and other traders. It will be the ideal opportunity to buy and sell any Morris / Nuffield / BMC vehicle spares, automobilia and motoring memorabilia.

However, the 'biggy' as far as our branch is concerned is the Beaulieu Spring Autojumble on 18-19th May.

The 2013 Beaulieu event will run along the same lines as the Morris Minor 60th anniversary event did back in 2008 but with a LOT

more vehicles. We are hoping to have at least 200 vehicles in attendance covering the entire spectrum of Morris vehicles. As before the vehicles will be parked up in year order with a plaque in front of each one with its details on. There will be a display of 4 cars in the marquee along with a display of pictures etc. on the history of Morris. Each vehicle will also be listed in the main autojumble programme along with an article on the history of Morris. Anyone interested in participating is requested to complete a form to register their interest in the event in order that an official invite can be sent to them from Lord Montague. Each vehicle displayed will receive a free commemorative gift along with 2 free passes for the weekend.
