Too Many Morris Minors?

For many years now, the Branch has supported the Verwood Rotary Club Rustic Fayre held over the August bank holiday weekend for about the last 20 years. Many

of us who attended last year were advised on entry that in future, the numbers of Minors (and other models) would be restricted to 12 on a first come first served basis, in order to maintain the variety of exhibits attending. This caused some disquiet among our members and the Committee wrote to the Rotary Club of Verwood with the views of the Branch on the matter. Their reply is shown below. We take the view that it is rather arbitrary to put a cap on particular *models* of



classic car. We feel that the numbers of each type attending should statistically represents the spread of classic car ownership and hence, the corresponding interest in those cars. We could not see why they don't just introduce a cap on the total number. The letter text below admits that capacity has not been reached in the past—so it is difficult to follow their logic. To deny entry from someone who is willing to exhibit their pride and joy in this way is a bold step indeed!

What do you think? (Editor)

"Dear Laurie, It is to be regretted that we seem to have upset some factions of your Club, this is certainly not what we were aiming to achieve when we took on the Rustic Fayre twenty years ago. Over this period the Fayre has gone from strength to strength and its success has been the author of many problems (challenges) that we've had to face. You mention space, and that is indeed a big issue, even more now as the original car boot area is now lost to us. Yes we have to limit the size of the vehicle display out of necessity; but it is the need to represent a variety of exhibits to grab the interest of all sections of our visitors, that we've elected to limit individual models to twelve. This applies equally to all marges, not just Morris Minors. We do however hold a reserve list in the event that capacity isn't reached, but happily for us that has yet to happen. Please assure your members that we do value their presence at the Fayre, but as politicians often say "tough decisions' have to be made for the greater good". The Van from Uncle (Part 3—Final Instalment) (by Andy Dibb)

PART 3 CONCLUSIONS & LESSONS LEARNT.

Well, 12 years in the rebuilding and everything came in at a rush at the finish. In the last part I ended with getting with giving the body a coat of green Hammerite paint and making final adjustments ready for the MOT.

Two things conspired to slow progress towards the MOT, one being my Uncle Gordon who the van is named after (**GOR** 720**D**) passed away leaving Denise and I as executors to sort his affairs out. This took many months as he lived on the Isle of Wight and it involved many trips over there. Secondly the brand new braking system was binding and all adjustments, bleeding of brakes failed to sort it. Uncle on the islands estate was easily fixed spending time and pa-

tience however Uncle on the mainland's braking system was another story.

I lost count of the number of times I adjusted, bled and tried different spring return settings to no avail. They ran free and as soon as you applied the brakes they bound up again. A rare spare evening presented itself so I sat down with every manual I had on

the minor's braking system and low and behold I found the answer. The wording, not very politically correct in this day and age went "If an ignorant person alters the master cylinder or its settings then the factory settings on the push rod may need adjusting." It took about thirty minutes to adjust correctly and hey presto free running brakes and no binding.

Andy's tip#1: if you are the person (or *ignorant person* like me) who replaces a master cylinder and pedal assembly like for like do

not think that the factory setting will be correct.

It was now nearly ready for its MOT and I called in to my centre on Saturday to book it in for the following week, "to be told go home and get it now, I will do it straight away". With trepidation we drove the 3 miles to the centre and everything went well passing the test with flying colours.

The following week I had to deal with the DVLA at Swansea who took about two weeks and then I was required to visit their local office at Bournemouth. The Bournemouth office had the most helpful office staff I have experienced in a long time, only ten minutes and I had a free historic vehicle tax disc and a new log book ordered.

That evening I contacted my old work mate Bob who had said he would spray the van many years ago and yes he would still do it.

The surprise was he wanted it as soon as possible as he had a shortage of work so that Saturday I took it on a longer journey to Totton.

The respray took about two weeks and it involved stripping to bare metal, prepping, 2 undercoats, 4 top coats and 2 times in the oven.

I had to pick it up from his workshops at Romsey and what a surprise I had awaiting me!

The workshops are used for coaches and lorries and there looking lost amongst all the big boys was my van looking like a dinky toy fresh out the box.

Andy's Tip#2: if you do not want to upset Bob, do not use Hammerite paint as it is difficult to remove.

I have a few jobs to do on the inside these being lining out the back with board and insulation. The dash board also needs sorting out with extra gauges to fill the previously owner-drilled holes.

The main thing I need to do is start using it instead of just looking at it. It will need to be run in for a few hundred miles to make sure everything is settled in, after all it has had a total nut and bolt rebuild.

The questions people ask me "are you pleased with the final result?" well yes I am. "Would you do the same again?" probably not as I have now reached 60 and feel I could not fit another one in. (That's what they all say – Ed) "What would you do different if you did do another one?" I would probably contract a lot of the difficult tasks and just do the fun bits of assembling. "Are you going to sell it?" No.
