
Well that' it for now . Hopefully now the dark nights are with us I can do a bit more spanner work in the garage during the long winter months! Best wishes

3 Door Morris Minor Shooting Brake

(The Restoration of RMJ 920 by Marcus & Sparky Ward)



These days folk talk about going on a journey when they embark on a project; when we started on the job of restoring RMJ 920 the phrase hadn't been invented! There has been a lot of interest in the car as we have travelled around the country; even stopping at motorway service stations for a comfort break has drawn an admiring crowd! We have been asked hundreds of questions at rallies and car shows most of which we have been able to answer but some, especially those relating to Dorcas' early life,

we have had difficulty with.

We first saw an advertisement in the Thames Trader for a 3 door Traveller but ignored it thinking that it must be "home made"! Later we found a centre page 'write up' in the 'Minor Matters' magazine (Jan/Feb. '87) showing 'A Very Special Traveller'. After contacting the vendor it was confirmed that the vehicle was indeed RMJ 920 so my wife and I travelled from Stevenage Herts to Braintree Essex, bought the vehicle and drove her home.



This was in 1988 from which date the car remained garaged for 18 years. Recently, changes in our circumstances and finances enabled us to embark on the restoration project.

The main part of the restoration took just under 2 years, the Project Manager being Steve Foreman of 'Woodies' (Traveller Woodwork) who also specially manufactured, fitted and finished the woodwork. The steel body panels and a new commercial chassis were sourced, and welded structures were manufactured and fitted, by John Merritt and his team from Mid Sussex Minors.

As the vehicle was dismantled parts fell off in heaps of rust and rotten wood showed where stag beetle larvae had taken up residence.

The rear springs were broken, the fuel tank resembled a pepper pot and the base of the doors looked like lace curtains. Even the rear axle casing had lost its leaf spring locating brackets to the 'rust bug'!

Being a bespoke vehicle, much of the flooring was made up of riveted aluminium sections

assuming that the chassis would hold everything together without the need for box tion sills. During restoration the flooring was placed by steel integrated with box sectioned steel sills. This eliminated the old dency of body sag.

A new aluminium frame was fabricated to house the original factory fitted sunroof.

The original 948cc engine was replaced by a

1098cc unit including gearbox and differential. The front brakes were changed to servo assisted Ford based disc brakes. New wiring incorporates an alternator instead of a dynamo (a negative earth system) and the trafficator arms have been replaced by flashing indicator lamps; seat belts have also been fitted. These changes have been made to enable the car to be driven safely in modern traffic conditions.

We have had some success in discovering the history of this unusual vehicle and the search for information goes on but as far as we know at present, RMJ 920 initially left the factory as a 1/4 ton van painted Empire Green and was sold to a dealer in September 1956. The car was red when we bought it. Whoever purchased the vehicle (registered in Bedford) had the van body replaced by a personalised shooting brake body designed by an engineer at Morris Motors Ltd, Cowley, Oxford. The design was based on an extended chassis as shown on a "marked up" Morris Motors Ltd chassis drawing.

Incorporating a chassis and the narrower van doors enabled a rear wood framed near-side passenger door to be fitted. The back end shows a drop down tailgate and a raised



upper window instead of the original Traveller design of two side hinged doors.

The restoration is now almost complete. The chrome plated screws and wing nuts on the roof are for fixing the purpose built roof rack which has yet to be prepared, treated and painted to match the car.

Other up-dates incorpo-
