

Hello everyone and welcome to the AGM issue of the newsletter—containing the minutes of the last meeting held on 1st October 2014. 


The Isle of Wight MMOC Rally—Roger Kellow

Treasurers Report

Good evening everyone. I hope you all have your copy of the branch accounts with your newsletter tonight. As you can see we have had another solvent year and the Branch is still looking quite healthy financially. We have not had any major expenditure this year, apart from the May Beaulieu event where we started to promote the 2015 Moggie Fest (or Southern Regional Rally) for those non-trendy people. The beautiful backdrops made for us by Roger Kellow for that event will be re-used then. As you can see, we have one of them here tonight. Thank you, Roger for all your hard work and Marilyn for putting up with you doing them. The chosen charity for this year, Zoe's wish raised £170 from the Blind Auction and £23.50 from the sale of CDs donated by Roy and Sue Gale. The Committee decided to round this figure up to £200 and a cheque has been sent to them. The rebate from the MMOC amounted to £122 this year, so please remember to sign the blue book if you are a member of the National Club.

The books are available here and a breakdown of the Spares, Regalia and Rally are also here if anyone wishes to see them. Are there any questions?

Editor's Report

Hopefully the newsletter meets everyone's approval. Don't forget to let me know if you would like more or less of any particular thing. As always, contributions are always welcome and make my job as editor a bit easier! The website is now 10 years old, having been started in 2004 and appears to have clocked up over 98,000 hits in that time. It seems to be a good way of buying and selling cars, with several recent successes. Just drop me a note either verbally or email, if you want to sell (or buy) a Minor. It also seems to attract interest from both inside and outside Dorset. I get a steady stream of gueries and comments from outside the Branch so I guess it must come fairly high up the search engines results rankings. I have also been trying to expand the knowledge data base under the 'Technical' section with useful bits of information. If anyone has ideas or suggestions for this, please let me know. The Spares Service has had another good year returning a surplus of about £2,700 to the Branch reserves. Over the last three years, we have shifted over £50,000 worth of spares with a total surplus over the three years of £7,927which represents about 16% on sales. The value of stock held has increased a little over last year's figure meaning that overall; we have shown a surplus (over the 3 years) of £1,145. The stock value seems to have reached a natural level now, so I don't antici-

I read with much interest the articles on extra gauges that can be fitted to the Minor. An enlightened management would have fitted an oil pressure and water temperature gauge as they did on the Mini - as a sensible upgrade. However as we know we soldiered on with no idea what was going on under the bonnet until it was too late.

My van had two gauge sized holes drilled either side of the speedo in roughly the same positions as the mini. I had 2 choices cover the holes with a later type cover or fit the gauges and make a similar type cover out of sheet stainless.

After much thought, I decided on the latter and made my own cover, fitted an oil pressure gauge and an electric sender type temperature gauge. I also found that the original chromed end pieces still fitted.

The oil pressure gauge was plumbed in with a tee-piece, the existing pressure sender switch was

fitted into one port of the tee and a plastic flexible connection in the other leading to the gauge.

I removed the blanking plug from the head, spark plug side of the thermostat housing and fitted a sender. A wire was run from the sender to the gauge and then a wire to the low voltage connection at the back of the speedo.

All works well and I can see at a glance what "Gordon" is up to under the bonnet.

I have enclosed a photo of the finished article, not original I know but a sensible upgrade.
