Editorial

Hello everyone and welcome to the Newsletter. I hope you all survived Storm Katie intact. Roy and I knew it was on the way so he helped me replace our garden fence the week before.

Have you ever been to Mercedes Benz World in Weybridge (nr. Brooklands)? We went a few weeks ago with Nev and Lyn—for the weekend, taking in MB World on Saturday and Brooklands on Sunday. The Mercedes World Building is basically a cross between a dealership and a museum. There are plenty of classic Mercs there as well as a lot of new ones (as one would expect). But the highlight for me was the outdoor ______ activi-





consists of two high speed circuits and a wet skid circle. There are also other areas for 4x4 and under 17 training. I had previously booked a half hour experience (for £85) in an ordinary 'C' class saloon for 4:00 pm. Meanwhile, Nev managed to win a draw which entitled him to a passenger ride in one of the lunchtime high speed display cars. The

display (by the 'Silver Arrows') was pretty spectacular and Nev returned shaken up but exhilarated. When I checked in for my 'experience' I was offered the chance to upgrade to an 'AMG' for another £20. I think this was probably the quickest decision I have ever made in my life. I did, of course scratch my chin and look towards the 'Treasurer' for her approval. But how could I turn that one down? I was a bit late going out as my driver 'James' needed a comfort break, but then I found myself in the latest AMG C63, which actually looks like quite a harmless saloon. Technically, this is a 4 litre 470hp V8 beast complete with 'flappy paddle' gear change, double electric clutch system and an 'automatic-manual' (if that makes sense!) six speed gearbox After a couple of slow laps on the smaller northern circuit, we ventured on to the long straight for a couple of full-on take offs. The first was pretty spectacular just doing a normal foot-to-the–floor start, the scenery went by like it did on Star Trek when Scotty engaged the Warp Drive. The second was even more spectacular and we utilised the Launch Control program setting which allows you to spool the engine up to full power with the left foot on the brake pedal. When you let it go, the end of the straight comes up almost instantly and you wish it was a few miles further south so you can keep accelerating! (somewhere near the M25 would have been good!). We then had a go on the slalom which you could drive through at a speed

BRANCH SPARES DEPARTMENT:

For the benefit of newer members who may not be aware of it, the Branch operates a Morris Minor New Spares service. Cake Competition

If you are thinking about entering the Grand DMMOC Baking Competition at the June Clubnight, here is the approved 'standard' recipe. (Kindly provided by Helena Carr)

Coffee Sandwich Cake

Method

Preheat the oven to 180 c/ fan 160 c/gas 4. Grease 2 x 18cm (7") sandwich tins and line the base with greased baking parchment. Dissolve the instant coffee in the hot water. Whisk the caster sugar and margarine until light and fluffy. Add the eggs one at a time, whisking well between each and then add the dissolved coffee.

Gently fold in the sieved flour and baking powder, with a metal spoon, until well combined.

Divide equally between the prepared sandwich tins and level the tops. Cook for about 20 minutes or until well risen and the tops of the cakes spring back when lightly pressed with a finger.

Once cakes are cooked remove from the oven and leave in the tins for about 5 minutes before turning out onto a wire cooling rack. Carefully remove the lining paper and leave to cool completely.

To make the butter icing, dissolve the coffee in the hot water. Cream the butter and icing sugar until light and fluffy and add the dissolved coffee.

When the cakes are cold, sandwich together with half of the butter icing and spread the remainder on the top. Decorate with walnut pieces if desired.

Ingredients:

150g (6oz) caster sugar
150g (6oz) soft margarine
150g (6oz) self raising flour
3 eggs
1.5 tsp baking powder
1 tbsp hot water
1 tbsp instant coffee (more if you like it strong)
For the butter cream filling:
225g (8oz) icing sugar
100g (4oz) softened butter
1.5 tbsp instant coffee
1 tbsp hot water

THE PRACTICAL CLASSICS RESTORATION AND CLASSIC CAR SHOW. 5/6 MARCH

Is it just me or just pure coincidence that it's all or nothing with functions and gatherings ? Just like waiting for a bus then two come along at the same time . And when the chance comes to use one of our Minors (weather conditions allowing) in early March then dates clash . Such as the Brooklands Austin/Morris day ,which I never miss , and the NEC Practical Classics Restoration show which both turned up on the same weekend this year ! And to add to the problem the local councils were out throwing salt about as if it's going out of fashion

This winter I have managed to put some 200 miles on each of my Minors because in our area our roads haven't needed much salt .

I made the decision to attend the NEC show in a modern vehicle on the Saturday and then see what weather conditions prevailed for the Brooklands Sunday.

The Restoration show is in its third year now and was the best yet. This year the star of the P C Live Stage Restoration was the Reliant Regal Supervan III. This particular van has spent 19 years in a shed since it was used in the famed Fools and Horses episode "Heroes and Villains " with Del Boy and Rodney as Batman and Robin. A fact verified by the owners, the family of the creator of the series , the late John Sullivan . It has been kept by one of the programme 's producers since 1997 and hasn't been seen in public since that year. By the end of the show it was hoped that the restoration would be complete and John's brother Jim would drive it off the stage .

The guys from Practical Classics had help from the Reliant Three Wheeler club whose slogan is "Reliant Building Unstable Cars for Unstable People Since 1935 " One fact I didn't know about the Reliant is that they all had a reverse gear but this was blanked off by a bolt in the gear box, this was to get over the

driving licence issues in the 1960's . Another fact was when Clarkson rolled one and



took the p... it was fitted with a 10 inch wheel on the offside against a 12 inch one on the near side.

The restoration team was aiming to make the Reliant a mechanically sound vehicle by the end of the 2 days but it didn't have to look smart as it still kept its original patina . The team managed to fettle the engine into life and run it for a minute at 4.30 on the Saturday afternoon and then it suddenly stopped . Under investigation it was discovered it had feasted on its distributor drive . After begging and borrowing parts and not much sleep the engine was up and running again by mid morning on Sunday . Later on Sunday Ant Anstead , "For The Love of Cars " presenter took it for its first journey in 19 years around the show's Live Stage ! *Cushty*.

The guys from The Wheeler Dealers show , Mike Brewer and Ed China were in attendance giving useful tips and information . And there was also lots of tinkering and fettling being carried out by numerous car clubs. There was also a very large auto jumble and some really interesting 25 barn finds including a split screen VW bus that looked as if it needed a magician to get it into shape.

For those with big purses Silverstone Auctions achieved some really high prices , one being £47,250 for a 1948 Series One Land Rover (chassis 149).

With so much to see the day went by in a flash , I didn't leave the halls until 5.30 (a long day as I was there at 9.00 when the doors opened). With 20,000 visitors attending over the weekend, 700 cars on display and 120 classic motoring clubs (including MMOC) , specialist restorers and industry experts on hand this was a fantastic show . I have the dates for next year's show in my diary - 25/26 March 2017 . Let's just hope it doesn't clash with Brooklands .

Eventually arrived home at 7.15 very tired but very happy with the full intention of taking Rupert (the green Austin badged van) to the Brooklands Austin/ Morris day the following morning . However with an overnight temperature of minus 5c and the roads covered in salt I decided against going . I'm very sorry to have missed it .
