'HANDMADE' - The making of a Morgan—by Marcus Ward

For me and my brother John, it was a rare opportunity to have a 'boy's day out' together and he arrived early from Ottery St Mary to collect me from Nailsea giving us time to have a good full English breakfast on the way. We still had time to look around Malvern before meeting up with Nigel and the rest of the group.

Our tour guide, also John, met us promptly at 2pm and following the usual 'health and safety' talk - no flash photography, do not stray over the marked tour path lines etc; we were on our way! The first event of the afternoon was an archive film showing the early years of Morgan cars. We were then brought into the present with the most recently designed car - a full sized car with a 'cut away' section where all the components could be identified - the ash frame, aluminium chassis supporting the passenger compartment, drive train and the external body panels, wings and bonnet - also made of aluminium. Next we went into the woodwork shop to see how the laminated ash internal body frame components are glued, clamped and braced, then left to cure. Once cured and stabilised, the aluminium front cowling and rear wings are fitted to the ash frame.

Our next port of call was the assembly shop where the chassis, axles, drive transmissions and braking systems are all put together. The unique feature of all the workshops is that each stage of the build is done on trestles - where every-thing is assembled by hand.

In the final stage assembly area are large tables where interior leather trim patterns are cut to shape ready for the trimmers to use. At this stage all the cars are fitted with painted panels whilst the interior trimmers finish their work - job done!

On display in a showroom nearby are Morgan cars made for specific customers; these include Ford engined 'Plus Four' i.e. four cylinders with four wheels, special racing editions and unique customer specifications with V8 engines - a very good power to weight ratio giving 0 to 60 in 4.5 seconds! A Morris Minor might struggle to keep up!

The final workshop is the 3 wheeler assembly area; these also are assembled at trestle height. Here we saw the latest 2 litre V Twin engine which is capable of 100 mph +; a great improvement on the 1930 JAP engine!

In the Archive Museum is the very first 3-wheeler side valve V twin with cycle wheels. Also on display is the original owner's Plus Four - a 4 seater tourer side valve car used as the family car!

I must say that John, our excellent tour guide, was a mine of information with great attention to detail. We all left clutching pieces of leather trim and ash blocks as mementoes of our visit!

I did fly the flag for Morris Minors by wearing my MMOC jacket, however, I couldn't resist bringing a Morgan home with me; unfortunately, it is only 2 inches long and made in China!

Huge thanks must go to Nigel Seymour for arranging this great day out; I'm sure that we all will remember it long into the future.

manning stalls etc. John will be asking you all for your help tonight. We will be giving your passes out tonight.


Hopefully I will have the passes for Classics At The Castle, Sherborne, for tonight or if not very soon. I will get them to you so don't worry.



Fire at Charles Trent Scrapyard, Poole, 17th June 2016 BY LINDSEY HARRIS | PUBLISHED JUN 17 2016

This evening, as I was making my way home from visiting friends, I spotted a huge plume of smoke on the horizon. Thinking it looked very near another friend's house, I went to have a look. In fact it was a huge fire at Charles Trent scrapyard.

According to Dorset and Wiltshire Fire and Rescue Service this evening, over 170 vehicles are estimated to have been involved in the fire.

Charles Trent's Managing Director, Marc Trent, issued a statement on Facebook which said: "A fire broke out this evening in one of our compounds. Fortunately no one was hurt and the fire was contained as quickly as possible.

Both the fire service and police have done an excellent job for which we would like to thank

them. The source of the fire is still unknown at this moment in time. The main business on Ringwood Road is unaffected.

Many thanks for the support from all the well wishers."
