#### Classic Car Trivia—Answers

- **Correct Answer: D. Jensen**—the Jensen Interceptor offered a combination of Italian styling and British luxury motoring. It was the first Jensen design that was built from steel, rather than fibre glass.. A distinctive feature of the Interceptor was its curved, wraparound glass tailgate
- **Correct Answer: A. Imp** the Hillman Imp was an attempt by the Rootes Group to take a share of the market that had been opened up by the Mini. It was a very different design to the Mini, being a synthesis of rear-wheel-drive engineering in a conventional body shape but with its water-cooled, all aluminium engine at the back and its boot in the front. One interesting feature was its rear screen that could lift up like a hatchback, enabling the rear seats to be used like extra boot space.



I believe the windscreen in the end was sourced locally and replace by the first Saturday evening of the MOT.

The Bearing Problem was Martin Wallis' Suffolk based late Traveller OCF 202G with front wheel bearing problems. The traveller has been modified with a Ford disc brake system, however the group of Young Minor Members on the Tour had a big box of various front wheel bearings as they all seem to have souped-up Minors, Martin was able to source a spare from their extensive stock.



Finally my friend John Dyson and Denise from Blackpool had a deer run into the side of their car on our way to friend, Dusty & Jacqui's (Morris Minor Convertible owners) place in Western Brittany, dusk was falling, I was following John, we had 3 miles to go to our friends old Mill when the deer shot across the road striking John's car in the passenger door his side mirror went into orbit and was never seen again. I asked Denise if the deer made any noise when it struck the car, she replied "Bang". Prior to this they had a encountered a problem

getting off the Condor ferry at St Malo, a crew member had directed them backwards into a trailer, causing slight damage to Johns rear woodwork. 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#### **2017 MOT Trip**

This year's MMOC overseas trip (otherwise known as the 'MOT') was apparently quite an eventful one this year. I had two phone calls over the first few travel days. One caller wanted a replacement gearbox as theirs was stuck in first and the second wanted a windscreen. However, they both managed to find replacements due to the resourcefulness of the other participants. Mike takes up the story...

"I have just returned from the Minors On Tour (MOT 2017) Rally in Brittany. On the way to MOT 2017 the Walkers, Dave & Jackie, had a problem with the petrol tank on their Vauxhall Cavalier. It required draining to remove rust particles. They had to leave the car at a garage about 80 miles from the Campsite "Camping Chateau Galinee", they carried on in a Hire Car for the duration on the MOT. On the last day, Friday, the event organisers arranged a visit to Velo Rail at Medreac, about 29 miles from the campsite. (see photo).

The gear box was being replaced when I arrived on the Saturday, The offending vehicle was ORU 874J a late traveller owned by Eric Moore, I believe somebody actually turned up with a spare gearbox.
