


The Annual General Meeting (AGM) will take place at our October Clubnight. 2 requests from the Committee:

In Memoriam: Bruce Eggleton



Bruce Eggleton died peacefully in his sleep. He had taken his Austin 10 out for a spin on a lovely sunny day, a few days before and was pleased with how the car had run.

Bruce belonged to both the Austin Ten Drivers Club and Morris Minors Dorset group; he had a lot of respect for the integrity of Minors groups' attitude to raising money for charities. He would have liked to have attended more Morris rallies, sadly his Morris Minor had not been cared for and was too unreliable (as the Recovery Company would confirm!)

The Austin, a credit to him with its reliability was too much effort to drive distances with his ailing health. To Bruce's credit he took the Austin on the Manneken Pis Rally 1989. London – Belgium Tour towing a trailer tent heavier than the car, although the car struggled, it made the 900 mile journey with a few hiccups – unlike some other drivers who had to turn back and attend the rally in modern cars, before they left England!

Bruce's will stated no funeral service, to this end after several very difficult years for us, he is at peace.

I wish the Morris Club every success for the future, especially in your charity fundraising. If a collection is held in Bruce's memory, I will pass on details of both charities mentioned in his will.

Many of you will remember Bruce giving help and advice on engineering matters as well as seeing him driving his 1933 Austin 10 that was bequeathed to him by his Grandmother in the mid 1970s.

Bruce would drive down to our meetings from his home in Chobham which was a round trip of about 150 miles. He was always willing to consider all engineering problems no matter how trivial or complicated. Many of us have cause to remember him fondly every time we use something that Bruce had sorted out for us.

We will miss him, Jim Eggleton, Jenny Sansom, Jackie Walker and Dave Walker...



Terry Kingston's Car Collection

As John reported in June '17s Newsletter, good friend and classic car enthusiast Terry Kingston of Henstridge passed away in May aged 66. He was a regular at car shows around the area and often seen in his Series II blue pick up. Terry left a fine collection of classic cars which he had lovingly restored and which have recently been auctioned

by Bonham's at Beaulieu Motor Museum's International Autojumble (2nd-3rd Sep'17).

The car which was expected to attract global interest will be the 1981 Ford Capri 2.8ltr. This was especially prepared at Ford UK for Henry Ford II and his wife to use when they were in the UK. It was the only one converted in the factory to automatic transmission and was fitted with soft leather trim. Amongst the other cars auctioned off is Terry's beloved blue Morris Minor pick-up which led his funeral procession to



Despite contracting polio at just seven years old and being told he would never walk again, Terry didn't let his disability stop him from working on the family farm at Twyford and moving on to his other passion, classic car restoration.

Terry's cousin Ken Kingston said: "What he managed to achieve with his disability was amazing, he restored more than 10 classic cars, all to an extremely high standard, attended lots of shows, won several awards and met many friends.

"Thank you everyone who has enquired about Terry's cars and thanks to the BVM you now know about the sale, so go along and the best of luck to you all."

The Club sends its condolences to his family. He will be sorely missed.


Combining both elements, Wendy and Martin bought into the spirit of the day and brightened up proceedings, taking their Minor and the Hippy Vibe to the venue.
