



This is Louis. He's 3 years old, from Salisbury and was born with an extremely rare genetic condition called CDG Type 1A which means he has global developmental delay.

Louis lives with his mum, Lucy Dunn. She's trying to raise £40,000 to fund intensive physiotherapy and specialist speech and language therapy that cannot be funded by the NHS to help Louis learn to walk and talk. She launched the 'Love for Louis' campaign in



August '17 and has so far raised just over £6,000—so there is still along way to go. And anyone who has tried fundraising for their beloved charities knows how hard it is to get people to donate to a good cause. And as Louis' condition is so rare, there's no charity to support him.

Louis has been through more than you would want any child to go through in a lifetime, but he remains happy, playful and full of fun. At 2 and a half he is still unable to sit unaided, crawl, walk or talk. He is progressing, albeit very slowly, and his family knows he has so much potential. His mum Lucy said "He is getting frustrated with it as he is so close. One day he will get up and start walking."

A week of therapy costs £1000. It is really working and allows Louis to achieve so much. But it needs to be continued therapy. With the right level of therapy we can help Louis to be able to walk and talk, so if you feel willing and able to support a small boy with big challenges to have the best shot at life, then please help by making a donation—however small. You could also support the campaign by hosting coffee mornings, disco events as well as taking on sponsored challenges.
