## THE 'BRIAN WOOD' REPORT and latest news from the Spares Dept.



It has been a funny old month in the Wood household. We started out with intentions of reducing our cars from 5 to 4. However, our 'eagle -eyed' Chairman (in his current state of reduced classic car activity) spotted a certain Lilac Minor for sale in the current edition of Minor Matters).

It turned out to be the Minor Million which has

history with the Dorset Branch.

The following day (Sunday) Laurie and I took a drive to Banstead, in Surrey to look at it and I ended up buying it.

So having not sold the Honda we now have 6 cars to store!

The Dorset Branch clubbed together and raised some money to buy the same car (EOS 444) in 1990 and restore it as a club project. It had been unused since at least 1980 having been bought for restoration but just stored. In 1993, when completed, it was sold to a branch member, Peter Challen who subsequently advertised it in Minor Matters and sold it to Paul Bonner in Surrey in 1997. Whilst a few of the restoration 'team' lamented the loss of the car to the Branch, we resolved to encourage someone in the branch to buy it back should it ever be offered for sale again. (Be careful what you wish for).

It arrived mid-November and it is in pretty good condition, having had some £3k of work done a couple of years ago. There are one or two mainly cosmetic items to attend to, so I made a list. I told the vendor that I would get rid of the cross-ply tyres in favour of radials and his response was "OK but don't put a V8 engine in it!" I will refrain from any 'modifications' which might detract from its originality but I think I will fit an extending bonnet stay and seat belts, as we feel a bit vulnerable without them. It has got a fully documented history with it, including the original log-book and the tax discs from when the Branch restored it up until when the DVLA stopped issuing them. The MOT's, servicing and parts receipts were all saved by the previous owner and have now been sorted into a viewable file.

I have been tasked with writing up an article on it, which some of the older members of the Branch will surely remember. As the Editor has a month off in January, I have got a bit of time to do it.

It just remains for me to wish everyone a happy Christmas and a prosperous Minoring new year.

That's about it for 2023, bye for now, see you in February. Brian.

#### **Graham Has All The Gear**



Having thoroughly rebuilt my engine from top to bottom, I then had the gearbox to sort out.

On the 903cc and 948cc engine the gearbox was called a smooth box due to the casting of the outside casing.

I had three 803cc gearboxes to choose from and it eventually was the earliest box from my car that had reasonable parts, especially the reverse gear which doesn't get a lot of wear.

The shaft for this gear is 11.5 mm as opposed to later 803cc ones of 14mm. You find out about all these odd things.

Having cleaned all the parts and filthy casings in paraffin, I started to locate as many new old stock parts and was fortunate to buy a new 3rd and 4th lay gear from Bryan Gostling of the National Club spares.

Also first layshaft, synchro gears and all the other parts needed for the rebuild to go ahead. I had the ever so helpful Brian assist on some of the process as he has rebuilt 24 or so boxes. There is an excellent 40 page guide by Geoff Taylor that can be downloaded from Andrew Bywaters site at Mirabelle Classic Parts.

I then spent many hours sanding and rubbing down the casing to a super finish and after all parts were assembled, two coats of lacquer to seal the aluminium surface.

Next time the engine and gearbox go in and the rear suspension gets stripped down and rebuilt again.
