Editors Report



Well another year has drawn to a close and we look forward to more adventures in 2024. With this in mind Joy and I made a new classic car purchase not a Morris however.

I think I know enough about cars to enable me to spot a suspect.

The new car had just finished a £8k restoration so was in good order . However the owner could not

drive it because of ill health. The car had not been run in so I took it to my local classic garage who I know. Nigel said he would get it up on the lift to see if it had any faults. This was not an MOT but a more comprehensive check cost £50.

He found 23 faults 19 could be fixed in a weekend such as a loose flasher unit. 4 he classed as dangerous and fixed immediately . The brake pipe was passing close to the suspension arm and as such rubbing might have caused the pipe to rub through. Swivel arms nut not tightened. Brake pipe not fixed could have been pulled away under car. Clutch actuating arm bent.

Whilst we are not legally required to have our classic cars MOT it is wise to have them checked using equipment that most of us do not process.

I gave a light hearted talk on our exploits in France last year at January club night.

We are going again in June and now have Seven cars making the excursion to St. Malo

THE 'BRIAN WOOD' REPORT and latest news from the Spares Dept.



Hello everyone, hope you have all recovered from the colds and viruses that have been circulating over the Xmas and New Year period. We have had our share. There's not much progress to report on the Minor Million, but the front seats have been away to the 'menders' James at Rawhide Trimming in Ferndown. He has done an excellent job of fitting new

straps to the seats and replacing the foam and hessian in the seat bases. The old covers have been re-fitted and are now a good shape, however, being white vinyl, they are beginning to show the effects of ageing. There are a couple of areas of minor physical damage, but mostly the issue is the consistency of the colour and various small marks etc. I have obtained a recolouring kit from Furniture Clinic (on James' advice) matched to a sample of the vinyl material. I also bought a 'repair' kit which is designed to fill and conceal small, damaged areas. From what I have seen of other applications, this seems to work well. Updates to follow. One of my Christmas presents, was Ray Newell's new book "Morris Minor Restoration Manual" (ISBN 978-0-7198-4297-9) which he kindly sent to me for helping out with a couple of the chapters. My fingers are extensively photographed in the sections on fuel pumps and carburettors. There are also few photos in the gearbox section too. I haven't read all of it yet, but it looks like a pretty comprehensive account of the intricacies of any restoration project and well worth obtaining if you are embarking on any serious restoration work.

Most of my garage time since the last report has been taken up with repairs to TDG 255 (4 door saloon) in preparation for a respray. It was probably naïve to think otherwise, but this has taken far longer and involved much more work than originally anticipated. (We have owned the car for almost 43 years and some of my original repairs have expired!) I have nearly worked my way around the external panels of the car in an anti-clockwise direction starting from the boot and am currently working on the front passenger door. This had a few small rust spots appearing at the bottom, but, you've guessed it, it needed the whole under panel to be replaced as well as letting in some patches on the outer surface. This has been a recurring feature of the task. The front panel had a couple of extra holes under the bumper line, which I thought could be repaired. However, when dismantled, it became clear that not only was the outer front panel scrap, but the bottom part of the radiator mounting panel had also dissolved. Fortunately, there is a cheap repair panel available, but there was no avoiding the significant investment for a new front outer panel from ESM. Still, the end is in sight, and I am hopeful that I can finish the preparation work before the end of February (fingers firmly crossed!). Stay tuned for more updates, next month. Brian

Graham Puts the Heart In

So here we go with another chapter or two.

The next stage in my ongoing restoration was to put the new clutch and flywheel with the

new ring gear onto rebuilt engine and attach it to the gearbox. I happened to ask that very nice man Brian to help with the hoisting of my engine and gearbox into the engine bay of my Series 2.

With lots of fleeces around the metal work to stop any damage to the paintwork, the engine with the gearbox attached went in relatively easily with no issues.

Prior to doing all this I had bought via ESM a new copper nickel fuel line that goes from the SU pump on the bulkhead down and underneath the car to the fuel tank. Fortunately I thought what was a good idea at the time having kept the original steel fuel line with all the bends in was to use it as a template. So starting at the pump end of the old pipe I started bending and adhesive taping the new pipe to the old, only to discover that the new pipe was about 6 inches too short.

ESM did not have any suggestions so I contacted a lady at Automec where the pipes are made and bought a longer length of fuel pipe and un soldered the nipple ends and re soldered them onto the new pipe bent and cut to the same length as the original fuel pipe. Success.

Next issue I will have stripped, repainted and fully rebuilt the rear axle leaf spring and attached the prop shaft.


can look cool at all of 2024's events.
