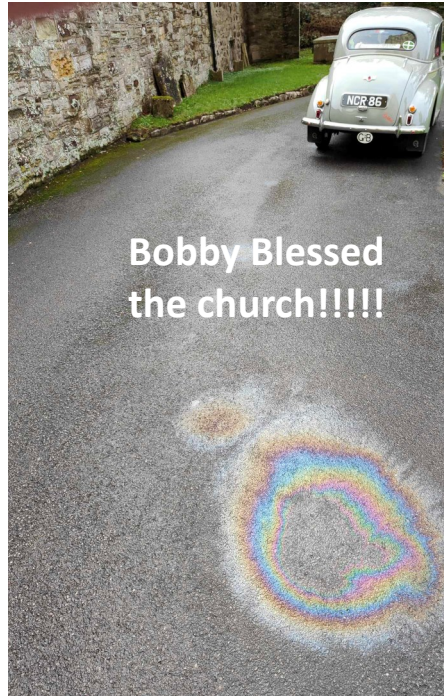
The route for the Easter run is being finalised remember April 1st behind the West Parley Memorial hall gather at 9am leave at 10am.

Hi everyone.

Not much has happened to the Million since the last report – most garage effort having been channelled into the respray job on the 4 door (TDG 255). My preparation work is almost complete and by the time you read this, it should be off to the spray shop for its new paint job in (GN12) Dark Green. While it is away, I plan to get on with the cleaning/refurbishing jobs on all the other ancillaries. The wheels have been sent away for shot blasting and re-enamelling in (GR3) Birch Grey. I decided to refurbish the engine bay myself. I masked and bagged up the wiring harness and removed all the other bits and masked up the rest – ie the shock absorbers, exhaust, wiper rack etc. As I have heard of some people spraying entire cars with aerosol cans, I decided to try to do the engine bay with a couple of cans of green from ESM. The result has turned out surprisingly well. The paint seems denser than it used to be in times gone by. There is a bit of an issue with 'mayonnaise' build up in the rocker box. This is caused by short runs which result in insufficient heat build up to boil away any condensation. I am therefore reluctant to strip it right down, as I know it will end up with the full treatment if I do. It has a rattling timing chain which I will replace with a duplex one and the water pump looks a bit dodgy. Graham Melly has kindly donated some blue enamel paint of the correct colour (Prussian Blue) so that will be applied. Since I find gearboxes a bit easier to build up than engines, I might break that down and replace the bearings and springs etc. It could do with a new clutch too. Otherwise, the rest is mostly cosmetic. The interior just needs a little refresh. I might re-colour the grey seats and panels – some of which need some minor repair. The headlining (which was replaced in the eighties rebuild) should be ok but the front plywood panel behind the windscreen has moved and it looks like the small clips that secure it have vanished. So that should be repairable with a bit of patience(!). The carpets will be replaced as I only bought cheap ones 'back in the day' and they have now served their purpose. They are unusual in that they are run across the car from left to right instead of front to back (as most others do). The chrome bumpers are a little tarnished but will be re-used. Most of the rest is ok also but the rear light fittings are past their best, as is the chrome grille surround. Stay tuned for further developments.

Finally, don't forget to use the discounted Branch Spares service, as the surplus goes towards the club funds as well as saving you money. Also, larger orders can always be sent directly to your address (if more than an oil filter etc) saving you a trip to Bearwood into the bargain.

I am particularly chuffed that Laurie explained that the Encephalitis international charity is going to be nominated as the chosen branch club charity of the year! When the press photographer sends some of his photos I will forward on any. Also hoping that he is able to do some media coverage for all concerned including the DMMOC of course. Kind regards Roger

May I extend the warmest thanks to those fantastic Dorset branch Morris Minor owners who brought along their Morris Minors and to those other members and friends who also attended to celebrate Encephalitis International's 'World Encephalitis Day' for the Thursday evening on the 22nd February at Christchurch Priory for the special floodlighting of the building. Branch member Martin Stokes specially made an amazing round trip of 200 miles from Bristol to join the Dorset branch at Christchurch Priory. What an incredible gesture of support from such a Morris Minor enthusiast We were lucky to have a window of clear dry weather after an extremely wet day during the evening for the press photographers photo shoot.

Having personally experienced the profound impact of being diagnosed over 6 months ago with Viral Encephalitis that led to 14 days unconsciousness and two brain seizures with further side effects of other life threatening issues. Following the effect this had on various, individuals, family, and friends, I am passionate about raising more awareness of this life-threatening brain condition and the importance of early diagnosis for people effected of any age group. Without wishing to be melodramatic I do count my lucky stars each and every day as I am still here to tell the tale purely down to the rapid action of one of the amazing Neurological team of medical professionals within the high dependency unit within Royal Bournemouth Hospital that came up with the diagnosis suggestion that I had actually contracted this neurological condition of Viral Encephalitis

Despite affecting more than 500,000 people globally each year, encephalitis remains relatively unknown when compared to other neurological conditions. Our aim is to change this by "shining a light" on encephalitis. The prevalence of encephalitis is rising not only in the United Kingdom but also worldwide.

What is Encephalitis ? - Key Facts

Encephalitis is inflammation (swelling) of the brain.

Anyone can get Encephalitis irrespective of age, gender, nationality or culture.

There may be up to 6,000 new cases each year alone in the UK and many more thousands worldwide.

Encephalitis can be caused by an infection (e.g. virus, bacteria etc.) or an inappropriate immune response directed by the body against oneself. In some cases, a specific cause cannot be found at present despite extensive testing

The variety of causes and presentations, along with the rapid onset (often dramatic) may often make the management of this condition a challenge for doctors.

Essential early and adequate diagnosis, leading to appropriate treatment, most often improve outcomes dramatically.

The length of time spent in hospital and severity (acute illness) can vary from days to months.

Unfortunately Encephalitis can have a high mortality rate depending on the underlining cause and how quickly it is recognised and given an essential early diagnosis.

Niagra Falls, CN Tower, Sydney Olympic Park, and Piccadilly Lights, BT tower, Alexandra Palace in London to name a few, (and this also included our own local 'namesake' town of Christchurch in New Zealand) with red lights to shine a spotlight on encephalitis. For 2024, we replicated and surpassed the 2023 achievement by securing even more iconic locations globally on 22nd Feb 2024 to celebrate World Encephalitis Day. 2024 holds immense significance for us, as it commemorates our 30th anniversary as a charitable organisation.

Thank you most sincerely to the Dorset Morris Minor Owners Club for nominating Encephalitis International as their chosen charitable organisation for 2024
