Update from Graham



After last months trials and tribulations with my Series 2, things are starting to get moving again to complete the car that Laurie says is being entered in next year's May Moggy Fest.

The headlining that was faulty, Newton Commercials agreed that it had not been made correctly and kindly sent a replacement. Which guess what, it was exactly the same as the original one.

I have since been helping Nigel Seymor with a customer's car that also requires a new headlining and James from Rawhide Trimmers is happy to make. He has my Newtons one as a template and he has agreed to add the faulty missing stitching.

The Autosparks replacement wiring loom is now fitted and nearly all the connections to various fittings are done. But I did notice that there are no wires to connect a second Lucas Wind Tone horn. ther side of the radiator and Autosparks have agreed to make a short two wire purple and purple/black braided wired loom for me.

I decided to go into my pit under the car and check all the brake connections to make sure that there we no leaks of the silicon brake fluid. Unfortunately the front driver's side tyre had fluid all down the outer side wall.



This turned out to be one of the two brake cylinders leaking.

I did have four original Lockheed made brake cylinders that I bought about 40 years ago and thought they were probably past their sell by date. So last year at the Beaulieu Autojumble I bought a set of four

pattern part brake cylinder that I thought was a sensible alternative. However having removed the pattern part cylinders and on checking the internal seals they were not very substantial in doing their job properly.

I then dismantled the Lockheed ones and they were as good as new and the seals are definitely up to the job.

Well, it has been raining a lot recently and in my case it has been pouring as they say.

I noticed that the oil gauge tubing from the he engine block that goes through the bulk head to the dash instruments was pushed downwards by one of the hoses of the Smiths heater under the dash. So I decided to unscrew the lower hose and reroute the oil gauge piping. But the brass tube broke off.

Having then removed the heater the other brass connection tube had a very visible fracture. I decided to cut off the damaged tubing and bought a section of new pipe that I cut and soldered back on.

On little thing that I had intended on making was the thin steel cable that secures the rocker cover oil filler cap to the side of the rocker cover filler neck.

I managed to find some stainless steel bowden cable of the approximate thickness. I then cut a small section of mild steel sheet then in

a vice folded that around the cable and soldered that end and attached a fine 1mm wide piece to the other end. This will go into the small hole in the top of the oil cap.

I hope to have better news next time such as carpets fitted, seats in and dash and glove box done. Fingers crossed once more.

BRIAN WOOD REPORT



Hi everyone.

We have just returned home from the Sidmouth weekend. We attended the Sidmouth Classic Car show on Saturday 21st and it truly was a cracking show. The weather was obligingly hot and sunny all day and there were about 350 vehicles of all shapes and sizes — always an interesting show. We came back home on

Sunday morning due to the weather — which by now had reverted to rain again! We also had a lot of things to do at home. We gave the convertible a run for this trip and on the way home, the temperature gauge kept creeping up to above 'N' where it usually sits happily. I noticed that when we stopped, I couldn't hear the electric fan (which was a new Revotec kit when the car was rebuilt). We got home OK and I got under the bonnet and discovered that the fan worked perfectly when provided with 12v, so I let the engine warm up again, burnt my wrist on the exhaust and found that the relay seemed to be spluttering in and out with little cooling effect. I have ordered a new relay switch kit and hopefully that will cure it. The only other thing it could be is the thermostat switch which is hidden in the bottom hose. Hopefully I wont have to dismantle that as well.

Earlier in the month was the Isle of Wight Rally at Havenstreet. which again was very good and well supported by us 'mainlanders'. We went over to that one in the Million and met up on Sat-



urday with Gevin and Elizabeth White who live in Sussex and own million number 320. We had afternoon tea at the Garlic Farm and dozens of people wanted to take photos of the two weirdly painted Morris Minors in the car park. Gevin took the prize for 'Best in Show' (at the rally, not the car park!). I have been doing a bit of work on the 4 door this month, albeit not so much on the shell. The ancillaries are being attended to as and when time permits. The engine has already been prepared with not much work being required. Just needed to replace the timing chain (with duplex kit) and give a good clean up and service. It ran just fine before the work commenced so I'm going against the advice I usually dispense to others, and re-fitting it more or less as



it is. The gearbox didn't appear to have any problems, but I thought it could do with a 'refresh'. In the event I found all but one of the synchro hub springs had broken, which is often one of the causes of skipping out of gear. I fitted new bearings and

of gear. I fitted new bearings and seals etc and it should now be good as purchased some kettle descaler a while ago to use on the radiator and heater. The radiator was (I believe) the original one as it has a little brass 'Morris Radiator Department' plaque fitted. The rad was still in good condition only needing a soldering repair to the outlet drain. So I did the repair, flushed out the scale and repainted it so it's also as good new now (I hope!) The heater matrix was similarly flushed out but not very much scale seemed to come out, but the water looked pretty clean now – so it should be ok.

Jacky and I have totted up the finances for this last year and the spares has had its best year ever with sales of over £31k for the year. The surplus returned to club funds was about 12% which is slightly less than the running average of 14%. I wasn't surprised by the increase in turnover as it has been very busy throughout the year. Graham Melly's ongoing project I believe is largely responsible for this year's performance (and updated on page 8-9). I think sales will plummet when he finishes it!. However, as previously mentioned, the margins are getting ever tighter. But as ever, it is the member's support which keeps it going so thanks for that and keep it up. Cheers for now, Brian.
